The Virginia Creepers have been playing Appalachian old-time string band music since 1991. The "Creeps" as they are affectionately known, come from a wide variety of musical backgrounds, but all have found a niche playing the original country music of Appalachia. As the 2001 winners of the Old-Time Band contest at the Santa Fe Bluegrass and Traditional Music Festival, the Virginia Creepers are arguably among the best practitioners of Old-Time music in New Mexico, an honor equivalent to having the best green chile stew in North Carolina.

for a weekend of fun at the 6th incarnation of **BOO Camp**.

Camp starts with registration on **Saturday morning (October 22) at 9 A.M. in the dance hall.**

Location—Camp Stoney, 7855 Old Santa Fe Trail, Santa Fe. The camp elevation is 7,200 feet with nighttime temperatures in the mid 40s or lower. For more information about Camp Stoney visit their web site at www.campstoney.org.

Directions—From northbound I-25 exit 284 (Old Pecos Trail), turn left at stop sign, proceed to stop light, turn right onto Old Las Vegas Highway, proceed 3 miles. Turn left on County Road 67C, proceed 1 mile to stop sign, turn right onto 67A (Old Santa Fe Trail), proceed 2.2 miles. At fork in road, go right (watch for Boo Camp sign and orange and black balloons), proceed 1.6 miles. Camp entrance will be on your left. Travel time from the exit is about 15 minutes.

From downtown Santa Fe—Take Old Santa Fe Trail and join the above direction at the right fork.

Sleeping arrangements—There will be women only or men only A-Frame dorms and one A-Frame for families with children. A flat grassy area is available for camping.

Food Service—Meals will be in the main dining hall/lounge/dance hall building a short walk from the dorms. The camp chef will prepare meals for us including vegetarian and non-vegetarian selections.

Children—This is a child-friendly camp. We encourage families to bring their kids and have them participate in the fun. Children's activities will be offered Saturday afternoon. Evening child care must be organized by the parents. All parents are expected to take a turn at child care. Older children are encouraged to join us at the dances and workshops.
